Mission to Ghana – Spring 2016

Objective and goal

Assist at least 2500 patients to better seeing.

Luggage

Luggage allowance per passenger on KLM flights to Ghana:

- 2 x 23 kg of check-in luggage

- 2 items of hand luggage total weight 12 kg (max size 55x35x25 cm)

Check-in luggage

All check-in luggage shall be glasses as needed for the mission. Each person shall bring four banana boxes, i.e. 40kg corresponding to 1000 pair of spectacles. Transport of glasses from VFA store to airport in Linköping can be arranged.

Two common suitcases

You can put your hygiene articles and extra items that do not fit into your hand luggage in a common suitcase. Each traveller can put up to 5 kg into the common suitcases. Please let me know if you have more items for the common suitcase!

Hand bagage

Most personal items are to be carried as hand luggage. It is important that the personal items are kept to a minimum as we can bring limited luggage. There is laundry service (paid by VFA) at some of the hotels where we stay. It is however recommended to bring some washing powder to rinse your shirts in the evening. Below are some suggestions for your packing:

- 3 shirts (you will be given one (or two) VFA shirt on loan for this trip)
- 2 shorts
- 10 sets of underwear
- X socks
- 1 pair of long trousers (use when flying and after dark when the mosquitoes come)
- 1 sweater (use when travelling by air)
- Hygiene articles (shampoo is difficult to buy in Ghana).

- Washing powder
- Mosquito net
- Mosquito repellent
- Antiseptic hand wash
- Towels (not always available at the hotels).
- Shoes for swimming/shower (there are "sjöborrar" in the sea)
- Swimming suit
- Passport
- Camera, mobile phone and chargers
- Flash light
- UK-type wall outlet adapter
- 1-to-many adapter (if you have many items to charge)

First aid kit

The project manager brings a first aid kit including pain killers, head ache, adhesive plasters, antiseptic spirit et.c.

Visa application

A visa is required for entry into Ghana. Visa can be obtained at the Ghana embassy in Copenhagen. Normal processing time is 10 days.



Travel in Ghana

A bus with seating for up to 16 people will be rented, including driver. In addition a pick-up will be used for transportation of staff and glasses. The Ghana team will travel to Accra with the bus and collect the Swedish team at the airport.



Workflow

There will be one station for registration and payment. This station will normally be staffed by Araba (who speaks one of the local languages).

There will be three eye examination stations, each staffed by one or two optometrist and if needed an assistant per station.

There will be one eye glasses distribution station manned by the remaining staff. This is where the patients try out glasses.

Local labour

There will be a local team in Ghana comprising two optometrists and one secretary. VFA will pay

the Ghana team 2600 GHS for the work.

Excursion

An excursion in the Mole National Park is planned for the first weekend. In addition we will visit waterfalls, a monkey sanctuary and perhaps also the Volta dam at Akosombo.

Accommodation and internet access

Accommodation will in general be very basic, but we have tried to locate a better hotel for the stay at the beach. Laundry service will be available at some of the hotels, but not all.

Internet access will be limited or unavailable at most if not all accommodations during the roadtrip. The project manager will arrange for a Ghana SIM-card and offer limited (slow) internet access via the mobile data network.

Local law and customs

There is a risk that we will we be required to pay customs on the glasses when bringing them into Ghana. We hold a certificate from First Intervention Ghana and a statement from the Ghana Ministry of Health, which has proven useful for passing customs.

Examinations and fee

There will be a charge of 3.00 GHC (5 SEK) for the eye examination, i.e. not for the glasses. Money collected for glasses are to be used for special glasses for patients for whom no suitable glasses are available on stock.

Patients who do not need glasses do not get money back. Patients who need glasses but for whom we can not supply suitable glasses will receive their money back.

Local currency

There are VISA ATMs in Ghana that can be used to withdraw cash money. Otherwise Euro, USD and Pound Sterling are readily accepted. Credit cards and Swedish kronor are not readily accepted. 100 SEK = 40 GHS (Cedi).

Vaccinations

Required vaccinations:

Yellow fever – **vaccination proof (yellow booklet) required for entry into Ghana**. If first vaccination it has to be taken at least 10 days before entry.

Recommended vaccinations: Malaria Hepatit A

Budget

VFA pays airfare, food and accommodation from entering the airport until return in Sweden. This includes e.g. entrance fees during excursions arranged by VFA, cost of Visas, laundry et.c.

Any personal expenses such as vaccinations, souvenirs, personal hygiene articles, extra drinks or excursions are to be paid by the participant.
